#### Pope Francis in Ireland

Last weekend about 45 of us, (adults and children) from Gurranabraher Parish left at dawn for the Phoenix Park; and despite a very long trek from bus park to the Papal Mass site – and despite the cold and sometimes rain of that day – we arrived back in Cork at midnight exhausted but gloriously happy that we had witnessed something very special; the presence of the Bishop of Rome amongst us. We pray that our faith is strengthened by this rare event – and that each of us now would assume a greater role in making Christ known in our neighbourhoods – the survival of the world and the happiness of each individual depends on it.

The two great mission statements of Jesus Christ are: "I have come to bring you the truth and the truth will set you free" and "I have come that you may have life and have it to the full". When we exclude Jesus from our lives life no longer has meaning - and existence becomes unbearably burdensome. Fitted into our very DNA is that unquenchable longing for meaning, for truth, for liberation – for God! The English poet, Francis Thompson, (1859 -1907), whose early life was marred by turbulence and despair discovers Christ and knows for the first time what it is to acquire truth and what it is to be free. In his greatest poem; 'The Hound of Heaven', he describes God as the chasing hound who never gives up until we are in his embrace. He begins his long poem:

"I fled Him, down the nights and down the days; I fled him down the arches of the years; I fled Him, down the labyrinthine ways of my own mind; and in the midst of tears I hid from Him, and under running laughter." He concludes his poem stating: "Halts by me that footfall: Is my gloom, after all shade of His hand, outstretched caressingly? 'Ah, fondest, blindest, weakest, I am He whom thou seekest! "

May Pope Francis' visit to Ireland ignite again the faith in Jesus Christ that once sustained and inspired the Irish people to be saints and scholars.
